THE DALITS

The caste system has existed in Nepal for centuries and permeates into all religions in Nepal. Despite a variety of efforts and legal reforms by the Nepalese government, caste discrimination persists within Nepalese society.

Dalits especially, face much physical and psychological abuse and are not allowed to enter some places of worship. Violence including murder (often related to inter-caste marriage) is not unknown.

Dalit women and girls, and especially those of the Badi caste are particularly vulnerable. Many are raped and forced into sexual slavery.
